#### Notes for PRISNOBUR I:

Clise, Clise, Clyse - as the name as been written in the United States of America. At the time of the immigration to this country, and the settlement in Pennsylvania, it was written: Cleiss, Kleiss and Kleitz. Prior to the migration to VA it had been changed to: Clyse, Klyce and Clise.

The name Kless, or as also written: Kleist, von de Cletz, Cless, Cleez, von Clais and Clest, if of German origin, it is said. As will be show the family originated from Pomeranian. The name originally derived form locality, this locality still in existence in Pomerania. Before the 13th or 14th century heredity names were as uncommon in Germany or on the continent in Europe as in England. As a rule, there were derided from the person name, the locality, or some identified feature of the character or the occupation. Kleist is situation a few miles directly east of Freinvide, north-east of Stargard on the Enzig Sea. The land was clay (klei, kleiisch, kleist) which, no doubt, gave the name to the locality.

As branches of the family settled in different areas, in each instance we find a slight variation of the name. This can be ascribed to the fact that a few, beside the office clerks, frequently monks, knew how to write. As a rule, names were written phonetically, and apparently new surnames were thereby formed.

Locality: The family originated in Pomeranian, formerly a considerable part of the ancient kingdom of the Wenda, or Vandals, which, from the year 1062 AD, had it's own dukes. A large part of the inhabitants were of Slavonic origin, and the Clanvonian language is still spoken in the north-east part of the province. The principal families were, however, Germans who settled there in the 12th century. One branch of the family lived in Courland, one of the Baltic provinces of Russia, had spoken the Krevenian language. Another branch settled in Zurich, one in Bavaria, one in Tyrol, one in Prussia, etc.

The Kleist family...traces its descent from a common progenitor, who, no doubt, took it's name from the locality. As nearly as the year 1248 AD, we fine one, Conrad Cleist, or Clest, a marshal who in the yar occurs as a witness to the charter granting the city privileges to Stargard, in Pomerania. (As appears from the Dredger Codex, Tomes, No 157: Grundungs pribellegium von Stargard) Prissibum Kleist "Herr zu Mutrin und Damen', and George Klesit "Herr zu Dubberow und Tychow' (Lychons), lived in the year 1320 AD. It is said that from one of these descended Bisprow v Kleist.
